





Network Convenes to Strategize Necessary Policy Solutions for People & Businesses

One SouthCoast Chamber announces the launch of the statewide policy network, the Massachusetts Chambers of Commerce Policy Network (the "Chambers Policy Network"). The Chambers Policy Network, led by the Presidents and Chief Executive Officers of large regional chambers of commerce, plans to use its collective statewide voice to advocate for policy and business issues that will strengthen the quality of life and economy in the Commonwealth. The Chambers Policy Network is designed to leverage the existing impact and onthe-ground local knowledge of these local Chambers to provide solutions to policy challenges that hinder the success and legacy of residents, employees, and businesses. Our goal is a growing statewide economy that works for all and strengthens our ability to retain talent and businesses in Massachusetts.

The Chambers Policy Network will focus on the issues that directly tie to the region's future: statewide competitiveness, taxes and revenue, transportation, broadband access, talent development and retention, housing, climate change, higher education, and the ease of doing business. Through this transformative and collaborative network, the immense

value of businesses, their employees, and their Chambers are leveraged to advance statewide equity and economic opportunity.

"The launch of the Chambers Policy Network is the region's first formal policy advocacy network of Chambers dedicated to solving the complex issues that our cities and entire state face. By unlocking the unique strengths of Chambers, we will be able to strategize and advance solutions to policy challenges. From housing to transportation, taxes, and business climate and more - all of these are interconnected and statewide issues that can help make Massachusetts a place where workers and businesses can succeed," said James E. Rooney, President & CEO, Greater Boston Chamber of Commerce.

Mike O'Sullivan, CEO of One South-Coast Chamber, said, "This is a new day for us on the South Coast. To be able to have the largest regional chambers band together over issues of importance for all of business in Massachusetts is a game changer. We can still engage on issues of importance to the region as a chamber and take advantage of the power of this new network to support common goals."

The Chamber Policy Network will initially consist of ten of the largest Chambers from across the entire state as founding

members with plans to expand to include other Chambers in 2024.



Rotch-Jones-Duff House & Garden Museum Seeks Volunteers



Curious about volunteer opportunities at one of New Bedford's most beautiful historic houses? The Rotch-Jones-Duff House & Garden Museum (RJD) will hold two Volunteer Open House Days on Wednesday, April 19, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. and Sunday, April 23 from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. Prospective volunteers are invited to drop by to learn more about the 1834 Greek Revival mansion from current RJD volunteers and Museum staff. Visitors will also have the opportunity to tour the historic mansion, fill out application materials, and enjoy refreshments.

RJD volunteers play an important role in the operation of the Museum and help in a variety of roles: they greet visitors, run the Front Desk, maintain the gardens, and assist staff with administrative duties. Admission to the Museum during Volunteer Open House Days is free, and no registration is required. These events are supported in part by the Massachusetts Service Alliance. About The Rotch-Jones-Duff House & Garden Museum:

The historic house, now the site of The Rotch-Jones-Duff House & Garden Museum, was built in 1834 for whaling merchant William Rotch Jr. This Greek Revival mansion, located on a full city block of formal gardens, is a National Historic Landmark, one of only 2,500 in the nation. The period rooms of the house chronicle 150 years of the economic and social evolution of the City of New Bedford, as reflected in the residencies of the Rotch, Jones, and Duff families and their domestic staff.

The Museum is located at 396 County Street, New Bedford. It is open Wednesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Advance booking for admission is encouraged, but not required. Admission is \$8 for adults; \$6 for AAA members, seniors and students; and \$3 for children (age 7-17). The Museum is free for RJD members, as well as for EBT, Connector-Care, WIC, and Wunderfund cardholders. The RJD gardens are open to the public at no cost and available to visit from sunrise to sunset, seven days a week. Visitors are urged to go to rjdmuseum.org to book their Museum visit and to review the most current information on hours and programs.



Cape Cod 5 Supports Local Schools with over \$120,000 in Educational Mini-Grants



Cape Cod 5 welcomed local publicschool teachers to their headquarters (HQ5) for a reception celebrating the 23rd Annual Cape Cod 5 Educational Mini-Grants Awards on Tuesday, February 28, 2023. At the event, at which teachers were celebrated for their innovation and dedication to their students, Cape Cod 5 acknowledged the breadth of this year's program, with 255 grants totaling \$122,556 to 300 teachers from 83 local schools across Cape Cod, the Islands and Southeastern Massachusetts. These grants, awarded through the Cape Cod 5 Foundation, will fund educational projects the teachers have developed, impacting close to 34,000 students, based on teachers' estimates. The winning projects cover a wide array of subject areas, including digital innovation, community advocacy and civic engagement, diversity and inclusion, social emotional learning, environmental sustainability and sensory engagement.

During the reception, CEO Matt Burke welcomed the award winners and shared his gratitude for the commitment and dedication of the local educators in attendance. Bert Talerman, President of Cape Cod 5 and Chair and President of the Cape Cod 5 Foundation, announced that, since the inception of the Educational Mini-Grants Program in 2000, Cape Cod 5 has awarded over 1,600 Mini-Grants totaling \$716,000. Chief Marketing Officer Stephanie Dennehy, who also heads the review committee, provided the data on this year's grant round and highlighted some of the projects that had received a Mini-Grant.

"Cape Cod 5 is proud to continue our partnership with our local educators, who maintain their commitment to their students by finding creative ways to engage, empower and challenge them," said Talerman. "We have the greatest respect for the role that each teacher plays in the development and perseverance of our future leaders and that is why we continue to identify Education and Enrichment as a key area of focus for our community engagement efforts."

Strength, Stability, Growth: Key Themes at BankFive's 167th Annual Meeting

New Trauma Clinic at St. Luke's Hospital



BCSB Awards \$20,000 Grant To The New Bedford Light



Bristol County Savings Bank (BCSB), through its Foundation, recently awarded a grant totaling \$20,000 to The New Bedford Light, a non-profit, independent digital news organization dedicated to community-based coverage of the important issues impacting the Southcoast Massachusetts region. Since the Bristol County Savings Charitable Foundation was formed in 1996, more than \$28 million has been committed to hundreds of different non-profits. In 2022, the Foundation awarded \$2.3 million to various 501(c)(3) organizations.

Specifically, the grant will support The New Bedford Light's Summer Internship Program and Community Journalism Project. The internships help expose interested young people to the field of journalism while gaining real-world experience as part of the news team.
